Application procedure	<p>ONLINE APPLICATION PROCESS</p> <p>The application process must be done by using the online submission tool: https://crm.enpc.fr/community/enpc/custom_forms/184</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Complete the online form; - During the application process, you will have to print the application form, sign it and upload it through the online submission tool; - The student must join the required documents through the platform; - On the last step of the submission tool, you will be asked to indicate the email of your referee. An automatic email will be sent to the referee, which will contain a link to allow him/her to join the recommendation letter. <p>Any incomplete application file will not be processed.</p>	

Learning agreement	<p><u>Validation of the the Learning Agreement?</u> Your study programme is established and endorsed by your home university, responsible for issuing and signing your Learning Agreement. Your study programme must then be officially accepted and endorsed by your host department at École des Ponts ParisTech.</p> <p><u>Changes to the initial Learning Agreement</u> Please note that we cannot guarantee your registration on all the courses proposed in your Learning Agreement because some courses have a limited capacity. The course registration process will normally end in the last week of September. Any course changes will be completed after this date, and in all cases before the start of the second week of the course. Any programme change must receive the official agreement of both your home university and your host department.</p>

Grading system	<p>Grades at École des Ponts ParisTech are awarded on a scale of 0 to 20. The passing grade for an individual course is 10/20. To pass a given year, students must have passed every course. If not, an equivalent course is added to the curriculum. In some cases, the year is to be repeated. Traditionally, grades higher than 16 are seldom awarded.</p> <p>A transcript of records will be sent free of charge to the partner university's exchange coordinator (or to the student) at the end of the study period.</p>

These scholarships include a monthly payment of 650 € for 10 months.</p> <p><u>Need-based scholarships</u> École des Ponts ParisTech also provide some grants based on social eligibility criteria, which means that we take into account the annual incomes of his taxable household. The total amount of these grants its calculated taking into account the financial situation of each student: annual incomes, and members of the taxable household.</p> <p><u>Corporate fellowships</u> École des Ponts ParisTech has strong links with industry and some scholarships can be awarded to international students admitted to the schools (Meridiam, Lafarge, Saint-Gobain...). Language requirements	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Requirements in French:</u></p> <p>100% of the courses are taught in French in our MSc in Engineering (“Diplôme d’ingénieur”). It is thus a requirement that all double degree and exchange students in this programme be proficient in French. We require a level of at least :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A2, for students coming from romance-language countries - B1, for students coming from non-romance language countries. <p>For applicants to the Urban Planning track of our VET department (City/Environment/Transportation), our requirements in French are :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - B1, for students coming from romance-language countries - B2, for students coming from non-romance language countries. <p>It is expected that all students provide one of the following certificates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - A French language certificate indicating the number of hours of French lessons issued by your home university; - Level A2: TEF 204 or DELF A2; - Level B1: TEF 361 or DELF B1; - Level B2: TEF 541 or DELF B2. <p>Please note that you must provide the official certificate of your French level before June 2nd 2021.</p>

	<p>Without the required minimum, École des Ponts ParisTech reserves the right to refuse the application for the MSc in Engineering (“Diplôme d’ingénieur”).</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>English requirement ONLY FOR DOUBLE DEGREE STUDENTS</u></p> <p>A TOEIC score of a minimum of 785 points (or equivalent international test such as TOEFL, IELTS or Cambridge Proficiency, CAE or FCE) is required by the French regulation in order to graduate. This implies that double degree students must have at least B2 level in English when they finish their studies at Ecole des Ponts ParisTech.</p> <p>Thus, we require from students applying for a double degree to provide an official certificate of an English level equivalent to B1, which can be either TOEIC, TOEFL, IELTS or Cambridge Proficiency, CAE or FCE.</p> <p>Please note that you must provide the official certificate of your English level before June 2nd 2021.</p> <p>On arrival, all students take an oral proficiency test. Depending on the the result, they may be required to sit the TOEIC test in September.</p> <p>Without the required minimum, École des Ponts ParisTech reserves the right to refuse the application for the MSc in Engineering (formation d’ingénieur”).</p>

Duration	<p><u>Exchange students</u> Various options of exchange programmes are available:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - one semester of coursework; - two semester of coursework; - one semester of coursework and one of applied project. <p>If students wish to undertake a semester of applied project at École des Ponts, it must be stated in their initial application.</p> <p>Please note that Ecole des Ponts ParisTech does not enroll exchange students for the purpose of achieving their thesis project?</p> <p><u>Double-degree students</u> Double-degree student must stay at least 3 semesters at Ecole des Ponts ParisTech. The actual duration (3 or 4 semesters) depends on the agreement.</p>
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Study programme	<p><u>Exchange students</u> Exchange Students must establish a study programme prior to their arrival on campus. They have to choose at least 70% of their courses (in terms of ECTS credits) in their host department.</p> <p><u>Double degree students</u> Double degree students must validate at least 120 ECTS credits to pretend to graduation :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 107 scientific and technical ECTS (including 2.5 ECTS for the compulsory internship and 30 ECTS for the final project), - 12 ECTS in languages. - 1 ECTS in sports. <p>Please note that all the updated information which students need to build their study programme will be sent to them at end of June 2021 by their host department.</p> <p>At the same time, they will also receive the information on how to proceed to course registration and deadlines.</p>
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Course selection

Double degree students

By end of June, double degree students will receive from their host department the detail of their study programme for the whole academic year to come. Some courses are compulsory and some other are elective.

They will be asked to choose among a selection of elective courses. Some of them have a limited capacity, especially in the Civil and Structural Engineering department. Thus registration to these courses cannot be guaranteed. Should this occur, students will be proposed alternative courses once they are on campus.

Exchange students :

By the end of June, exchange students will receive from their host department a list of courses available to them and a course schedule over the whole academic year for all the departments.

No course is compulsory. However, depending on the department, exchange students have to choose 50% to 70% of their courses in the list of their host department. With the course schedule, they can select the other 30% to 50% courses. Their registration to these courses must be validated by these departments' academic director.

It is the responsibility of exchange students to make sure that their registration have all been validated.

	<p>Some courses have a limited capacity, especially in the Civil and Structural Engineering department. Thus registration to these courses cannot be guaranteed. French language courses	<p>French language courses are open and compulsory for all foreign students enrolled in a degree programme. A placement test upon arrival is a requirement for defining their level and the courses that they will be taking. Intensive French seminars are organized each September: http://www.enpc.fr/la-section-de-francais?tab=informations</p>
Fees	<p>Depending on the terms of agreement with the partner university, students are subject to different tuition and fees.</p> <p><u>Double-Degree students:</u> All students have to pay the CMCI (special fees for international students) = 975€/year Tuition: waiver or domestic tuition (according to the agreement) = 3150€/year (2020-2021). In case of long internship: reduced CMCI (248€/year) for all students + reduced tuition 855€/year for students subject to the payment of tuition fees. CVEC (Contribution for student and campus life): 92€/year (2020-2021) for students subject to the payment of tuition fees.</p> <p><u>Exchange students:</u> Tuition fees: 525€ for 1 semester / 1050€ for 2 semesters. Exchange Erasmus + and Swiss European Exchange students are exempted from tuition and all fees (registration, examinations, and charges for access to laboratories or libraries) Exemption from CMCI and CVEC</p>
