

FACT SHEET: Bundeswehr University Munich (UniBwM), Germany

The main task of UniBwM is to provide officers and officer candidates of the Bundeswehr (=Federal Armed Forces) with a university education. Thus at present it is only possible for members of the armed services in friendly nations to complete a study program at our university, and this must take place in the framework of a scholarship or grant.

On the basis of bilateral cooperation agreements, it is possible for civilians from foreign countries to complete a portion of their studies at UniBwM. Currently, we offer foreign students the opportunity to stay for up to 12 months.

Academic Calender

In contrast to other universities, the standard period of study at the Bundeswehr University Munich is only 3 years for a bachelor's degree and one additional year of intensive study for a Master's degree. Therefore each academic year is structured into the following **trimesters**, not semesters:

Fall trimester: October 1st – December 31st
Official Christmas Holidays: December 24th – January 6th
Winter trimester: January 1st – March 31st
Spring trimester: April 1st – June 30th

Lecture-free time: July 1st – September 30th
