| <b>Application procedure</b>             | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Nomination:</b> Please send an email to <a href="mailto:overseas-in@intl.kit.edu">overseas-in@intl.kit.edu</a> with names, specialisation, period of stay at KIT and email address of your selected students by the above-mentioned nomination deadline.</li> <li><b>Application:</b> We will inform your students after the nomination deadline by email about the online application procedure. Further information is available at <a href="http://www.intl.kit.edu/istudies/3242.php">http://www.intl.kit.edu/istudies/3242.php</a>.</li> <li>Students will be asked to fill in the online application and print out the application form. This form has to be signed by the home university exchange coordinator as well as the students and should be uploaded along with <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a proof of German knowledge (and/or proof of English knowledge if the students plan on taking English-taught courses at the KIT)</li> <li>a Learning Agreement (list of courses)</li> <li>a current transcript of records</li> <li>a current enrolment certificate/ proof of matriculation at home university</li> </ol> by the above-mentioned deadline. We will confirm the reception of the application within 2 weeks. </li> <li><b>Acceptance at KIT</b> will be confirmed within 4 to 6 weeks after the application deadline.</li> </ol> |

| <p><b>Health insurance</b></p>        | <p>Health insurance coverage is compulsory for the <b>entire</b> stay in Germany (with a coverage of at least 100,000.00 €). Students can take out health insurance in their home country before arriving in Karlsruhe or take out German public health insurance before or after their arrival in Karlsruhe. We suggest them to take out a German public health insurance because not all the private insurance from third countries are accepted in Germany.</p>  |
| <p><b>Accommodation</b></p>           | <p>KIT reserves rooms for students from partner universities in students' residences if possible. Students need to apply for them. Rooms are not assigned automatically. These furnished single rooms cost 250-300€ and have a set lease period from September to February and/or March to August. No other moving in/out date is possible. Students will be informed about housing possibilities and application procedure within 8 weeks of the application deadline.</p>   |
| <p><b>German language courses</b></p> | <p>Since many courses offered at KIT are held in German, a good command of German is necessary for any student coming to Karlsruhe. <b>Recommended</b> is at least an <b>A2-level of the CEFR</b> (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages). The KIT Departments of <u>Mechanical Engineering</u>, <u>Architecture</u>, <u>Computer Science</u>, <u>Chemistry and Biosciences</u>, <u>Chemical and Process Engineering</u> require a <b>B1-level</b> of German language.</p> <p>We accept most types of German certificates including certificates from your university's language centre as long as it clearly states the <b>successful completion of the language level</b> with regard to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. This means that a simple certificate of attendance for a language course without any mention of a successful examination is not sufficient (i.e. participating in an A2 language course does not mean that the level has been reached).</p> <p>Should the German language proficiency not match the minimum requirements, we strongly advise all students to use the time left in the home country to obtain the necessary skills and we <b>reserve the right to decline the students' application</b>.</p> <p>If your students want to estimate their CEFR-level of German, they might do so using following online test provided by the Goethe Institute.<br/> <a href="http://www.goethe.de/cgi-bin/einstufungstest/einstufungstest.pl">http://www.goethe.de/cgi-bin/einstufungstest/einstufungstest.pl</a></p> <p>For a good start to the semester at KIT, all incoming students are given the opportunity to participate in a three-week German language course (beginners and intermediate A2-B2) before the semester begins. <b>This course is not a substitute for the certificate of the German language level required for the application.</b> During the semester, the Studienkolleg at KIT offers free German language courses for all students enrolled at KIT.</p> |
| <p><b>Visa/residence permit</b></p>   | <p>Exchange students from</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• non-EU member states or</li> <li>• non-EEA member states</li> </ul> <p>require <b>student visas</b> (not tourist visas) in order to study in Germany. This visa can be obtained at your local German embassy.</p> <p>To receive this visa, students need the "Zulassungsbescheid" (Admission Letter) from KIT.</p> <p>Please do note that the processing time for a student visa can take 8 weeks or longer depending on the local embassy. KIT cannot affect this procedure. Please inform your students to apply for a student visa as soon as they receive the "Admission Letter".</p>  |
