Application (continued) Learning agreement (exchange students)

Remote interview

All applicants will have a remote interview with the Academic Head of the department they are applying to and an officer of the Direction of International Relations at Ecole des Ponts ParisTech.

This 30 minute interview will be held in English or in French, depending on the applicant's choice.

Preparation of the Learning Agreement

Exchange students are required to provide a Learning Agreement.

Three elements have to be carefully checked when preparing the learning agreement:

- Scientific prerequisites: this is the most important element in assessing applications; non compliance with prerequisites leads to the denial of registration (See Scientific prerequisites section below).
- Course capacity; some courses have a limited capacity, and we may not be in a position to guarantee the registration even if it was set in the learning agreement.
- Delivery of course in the targeted semester: such information lies in the section "Time slot" at the very beginning of all course descriptions in our course catalogue. Sem 3 and Sem 5 stand for Fall semester, while Sem 4 and Sem 6 stand for Spring semester.

Learning Agreements have to be signed by the home university before to upload it in our submission tool.

<u>Indicative and definitive Learning Agreements</u>

Please note that the Learning Agreements required for the application process are indicative because the list of courses offered in 2023-2024 will not be known until June 2023.

Admitted students will receive in June 2023 all the documentation to complete their Learning Agreement and send it for their pre-registration. June Learning Agreements may slightly change in September, when courses begin (see below). Definitive Learning Agreements will be set in September. They must be officially accepted and signed by the host department at École des Ponts ParisTech and the home university.

Any programme change must receive the official agreement of both the home university and the host department at Ecole des Ponts ParisTech.

Scientific prerequisites

We insist that applicants should make sure they comply with our requirements. Non compliance will lead to the rejection of the application. Such prerequisites can be consulted here:

In 2022, they were required to be on campus on August 22nd. 	
Grading system	Grades at École des Ponts ParisTech are awarded on a scale of 0 to 20. The passing grade for an individual course is 10/20. To pass a given year, students must have passed every course. If not, an equivalent course is added to the curriculum. In some cases, the year is to be repeated. Traditionally, grades higher than 16 are seldom awarded. A transcript of records will be sent free of charge to the partner university's exchange coordinator (or to the student) at the end of the study period.

Health insurance	Health insurance is compulsory and free when studying in France. Once in France, students have to register for the French social security scheme. Such scheme reimburses up to 70% of major medical expenses. EU students are automatically registered provided they bear their European health insurance card.	
	To be fully covered, students can also register to an optional complementary private health insurance.

Language requirements (Continued)

It is expected that all students provide an official certificate (DELF, DALF, TCF or TEF) indicating their level in French. Please note that:

- Level A2: TEF/TCF 204
- Level B1: TEF/TCF 361
- Level B2: TEF/TCF 541

We do not require such certificate at the time of the application. However, students will have to provide it **before June 2**nd **2023.**

In the absence of the required official certificate or if the minimum level is not reached, École des Ponts ParisTech reserves the right to cancel the admission for the MSc in Engineering ("Diplôme d'ingénieur").

Requirements in English

We have no requirement in English for exchange students, as all the courses of our Msc in Engineering are taught in French. Exchange students do not have to provide any certificate in English.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION Exchange students can stay up to 2 semesters at Ecole des Ponts **Duration** ParisTech. Two options are available: one semester of coursework; two semesters of coursework. Please note that Ecole des Ponts ParisTech does not enroll exchange students for the purpose of achieving their thesis project, and cannot sign any internship agreement for exchange students. Exchange Students must establish a learning agreement prior to their **Study programme** arrival on campus (see section "learning agreement" above). As they will be registered in one of our academic departments, they have to choose at least 70% of their courses (in terms of ECTS credits) in their host department. Their Learning Agreement must contain scientific courses for a total of 20 ECTS at least. At the time of their application, the study programme can only be indicative since the list of courses is not known yet. Please pay attention to prerequisites and course capacity while choosing your courses. Make sure that courses are taught in the targeted semester. **Course selection** No course is compulsory for exchange students. However, applicants must comply with the 70/30 rule: 70% of their Learning Agreement must come from courses taught in their host department. Registration to these courses must be validated by the departments' academic director. Please pay attention to prerequisites when choosing your courses. This is particularly true for some 3rd year courses or courses taught in the spring semester which require knowledge taught in 2nd year of in Fall semester. Should the access to some courses be rejected, students will be proposed alternative courses once they are on campus. Detailed information on courses can be obtained in the course catalogue available at http://gede.enpc.fr/Programme/Default.aspx?Langue=en. Then select "Departments" and then the chosen host department. Exchange students are not required to take French language courses. French language courses However, they are accepted upon request and if full capacity has not been reached.

Fees

Depending on the terms of the agreement with the partner university, students are subject to different tuition fees and costs.

Note: all the tariffs indicated hereafter are 2022-2023 tariffs, and are subject to change in 2023-2024.

<u>Tuition fees for exchange mobilities :</u>

- 551 € for 1 semester / 1 102 € for 2 semesters
- Erasmus + and Swiss European Exchange students are exempt from tuition and all fees (registration, examinations, and charges for access to laboratories or libraries)
- Exemption can be granted to students coming from non-European partners if specified in our agreement
