



Language of instruction / requirements	French & English French Language Proficiency – Double-Degree programmes & courses taught in French Double-Degree and exchange students must acquire a minimum B1 level before their arrival (official certificate requested from home institution, or recent TCF / DELF tests) Students who are interested in the intensive French language course available before arrival at CentraleSupelec should visit the CAVILAM website: www.cavilam.com Double-Degree programs Supélec track - International pathway (Paris-Saclay campus) Most of the 2nd year core courses are taught in English > the minimum language levels requested are: French: A1, English: B1. Master programs: depending on the requested program (see specific prerequisites)
Grading system	CentraleSupélec uses the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS). The course load at CentraleSupélec is usually 30 ECTS per semester. NB: Centrale track: upon successful completion of the 30 ECTS, the CESI degree (Certificate of Study in Engineering Science) will be awarded.
	Grading scale: grades are awarded on a scale of 0 to 20, with 20 as the highest grade. The minimum passing grade is 10 to transfer credits.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Entry Regulations

Citizens of a EU member state, the EEA (European Economic Area), Switzerland, Monaco and Andorra do not require visas to study and work in France.

Visas & Residence / Work permits

Residence permit (for stays longer than 12 months)

Our Student Administration Office will help you get your residence permit once you have arrived on campus and will organize all the appointments with the French administration in order for you to obtain your permit.

The incoming students are responsible for paying for and securing their visa on time.

Warning: bring original documents AND copies of the requested documents. All official documents will have to be translated by a sworn translator officially certified and designated by the French courts or by a consular authority.

Insurance

Health care insurance is **mandatory** for all students in France.

- EU students: European Health Insurance Card is sufficient (EHIC).
- Non-EU students: French Social Security insurance can be taken out upon arrival (€215 runs for one year in 2017/18, not divisible per semester).
- Non-degree seeking students coming for a single semester: home health care policy can suffice. A copy of the contract must be given to the Student Administration Office (SGAE).

Upon arrival, a **comprehensive insurance coverage is mandatory, covering** lodging, personal liability and belongings.

Housing



On-campus housing is available for International students. Applications will be open to students after their official admission.
