	French Language Proficiency – Double-Degree programs & courses taught in FrenchDouble-Degree and exchange students must acquire a minimum B1 level before their arrival (official certificate requested from home institution, or recent TCF / DELF tests) NB: 3 rd year programs: Most of the 3 rd year courses are taught in French.View Miance FrancesStudents who are interested in the intensive French language course available before arrival at CentraleSupelec should visit the CAVILAM website: www.cavilam.com	
Grading system	CentraleSupélec uses the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS). The course load at CentraleSupélec is usually 30 ECTS per semester. Grading scale: grades are awarded on a scale of 0 to 20, with 20 as the highest grade. For exchange students, the minimum passing grade is 10 to transfer credits.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Entry Regulations	Citizens of an EU member state, the EEA (European Economic Area), Switzerland, Monaco and Andorra do not need a visa to study and work in France.
Visas & Residence / Work permits	<u>Visa</u> : information about the visas proposed to non-EU international students, depending on the length of their stay and the mobility program, are available here : <u>https://www.universite-paris-saclay.fr/en/e-international-welcome-office</u>
	<u>Residence permit (for periods of more than 12 months)</u> Our Student Administration Office will help you acquire your residence permit once you have arrived on campus and will organize all appointments with French administration in order for you to obtain your permit.
	The incoming students are responsible for paying for and securing their visa on time.
	Warning: bring originals AND copies of the requested documents. All official documents must be translated by a sworn translator, officially certified and designated by the French courts or by a consular authority.

Insurance	 Health care insurance is mandatory for all students in France. EU students: European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). Non-EU students: French Social Security insurance can be taken out upon arrival (free of charge, application link sent when the student finalizes his/her registration on GEODE platform). Non-degree seeking students coming for a single semester: home health care policy can suffice. A copy of the contract must be given to the Student Administration Office (SGAE). Upon arrival, a comprehensive insurance coverage is mandatory, covering lodging, personal liability and belongings.
